CHANGES TO ITINERARY

DAY 4: Depart Caernarfon to travel through Beddgelert and Porthmadog to Harlech to visit impressive Harlech Castle. A possible further stop on the journey at the fascinating Quaker Museum in Dolgellau and at the harbor town of Aberaeron. Continue to South Wales and one's next base in Wales' second city Swansea.

4 nights at the centrally located Dragon Hotel.

DAY 6: We start today's tour by giving you a taste of the beautiful Bower Peninsula. Continue to Pembrokeshire by far the most Celtic corner of Wales. We visit Nevern Church and St. David's Cathedral as well as some sites associated with Wales' greatest Anglo Welsh poet – Dylan Thomas (2014 centenary of his birth) including the Boathouse and Browns Hotel in Laugharne which was his favorite “watering hole”.

DAY 8: Depart Swansea for the Swansea Valley (possible visit – Dan yr Ogof Caves OR Rhondda Heritage Centre). Continue towards Cardiff and visit Penarth to see Joseph Parry's grave before checking in for final 2 nights at the 5 star Hilton Hotel overlooking Cardiff Castle and the impressive Civic Centre.
